

What? Why? & How?


The song was produced in a period of 5 days and consisted only of different electronic sounds. The entire song except the vocals has been produced with the trackpad of my MacBook. No midi keyboard was used. This was created when all of my instruments were in Pune and I was stuck in Bhopal due to the Pandemic.

I always loved producing and listening to Techno. I had performed my hour long live sets for underground parties earlier when I



was studying in Pune. I specially enjoyed the musical styles of Ben Bohmer, Boris Brecjha, Black Coffee etc. I even attended a party with Deborah de Luca on the console. Something about Techno always made me happy. I still cannot figure out why. I think it's just good background music.

One fine day, I encountered an advertisement of Production Music Live 's - Melodic Techno Course. I purchased the course and gained much results in lesser time. This was a track made by DJ Francois. I followed the tutorial but did much adjustments to it with my choice of notes. I was traveling with Udit back from his jam room and I played my song for him. It was named 'Zombies Demo' at that time. Zombies being the people who tap to repetitive music in dark rooms. Just like PAC-man. Udit loved the track and kept a copy of the track with him. After a couple of days, he reverted back the song with his vocals over it. It felt as if someone has added a soul to the music. It wasn't just random beats and melodies anymore. It was now renamed to Hush River. The vocals gave meaning to the song and thus ended up in the album. Months later I booked a recording session with Udit at my studio and recorded the final vocals. It took another couple of months for me to produce the vocals, mix & get it mastered.



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
